
Leave yesterday with its hurts and aches;

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## PCC's MODERATOR, RT. REV. FONKI SAMUEL OPENS SYNOD OF VIGILANCE AT PC BUEA TOWN

he 2020 Synod Committee dubbed; "Synod of Vigilance" culled from 1 Corinthians 16:13 opened with a service at Presbyterian Church Buea town, the presbytery seat of the Fako North.

The Sunday November, 22nd 2020 service marked the second time PC Buea Town was hosting this event, which according to the Presbyterial Secretary for Fako North, Rev. Foncham Ezekiel, was hectic organizing, but turned out to be a huge success. "We had to put up several committees in the build up to this event. We had from protocol to logistics, and all these persons were on their feet to welcome the several pastors coming in" Rev. Foncham noted with satisfaction.

The Moderator of the PCC, in his sermon, said Presbyterians and synod committee members must be alert at this time and be vigilant in prayers, adding that the Synod Committee of Vigilance is there to enable the church take decisions that will continue to keep the church alert in these trying moments since the church cannot close their eyes to the happenings around.

"Paul wrote to the church in Corinth asking the Christians to be on their guard. Apparently, they were not and needed a reminder to do so. This message is one that also goes to PCC Christians all over, that they should be vigilant against detractors, and to the synod delegates who begin meeting, they must be vigilant to take decisions that will affect our church positively" Rt. Rev. Fonki Samuel Forba noted.



The event which was spiced with several songs from choirs, saw a showcase from two choirs: the Restoration Choirs Association (RECA) which sings in the Mokwpe language, from the South West Region, and the Hallelujah Choirs Association of PCC Buea Town, which sings in the Metta language from the North West Region.

Rt. Rev Fonki equally used the occasion as an opportunity to caution groups of the church and Christians to promote African and Cameroonian values, especially in their singing, as he encouraged groups and choirs to use their mother tongue in composing songs and also in their communication.

This opening ushered the Synod delegates deliberations on pertinent issues on Monday November 23, 2020 at the Synod Office PESH Guest House in Buea.

The Synod Committee meets every other year and deliberates and decides on behalf of Synod.

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#### A Statement by the Religious Leaders of Cameroon on the State of Affairs in the Republic of Cameroon

We the Religious Leaders of Cameroon representing the Roman Catholic Church, the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon, the Cameroon Baptist Convention, the Anglican Church in Cameroon, Eglise Evangelique du Cameroun, Eglise Fraternele Lutherene du Cameroun, Eglise Prostestante Africaine, Eglise Presbyterienne Camerounaise, Union des Eglise Evangelique au Cameroun, Union des Eglise Baptistes du Cameroun, Eglise Evangelique Lutherene du Cameroun, Native Baptist Church, The Full Gospel and the Federation of Pentescostal Churches in Cameroon and the Muslim Faith, attending a Capacity Building Workshop on Peaceful Conflict Resolution and Sustainable Peace for Pastors and Church Leaders in Cameroon at Buea from the 24<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> of November 2020, found time to examine the state of affairs in Cameroon.

After due examination, we observed the following;

- that the cost and consequences of the armed conflict in Anglophone Cameroon and the Boko Haram insurgence in the North are becoming increasingly unbearable on the local populations who are paying a high price for these conflicts;
- -we the Religious Leaders of Cameroon acknowledge our neutrality and impartiality, while reserving our rights to point out what is right or wrong in any conflict situation, decided to make the following declarations:
  - I. Acknowledge government's various measures to resolve the Anglophone armed conflict like the creation of the Commission for Demobilization, Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration of ex-fighters, the Grand National Dialogue and the Presidential Plan for the Reconstruction of the North West and South West Regions.
  - II. Encourage the government of the Republic of Cameroon to continue to expand her quest and search for lasting, genuine, acceptable, just and peaceful ways to resolve the Anglophone crisis.
- III. That the government of Cameroon should consider less and less the military option to resolving the Anglophone crisis because conflict among

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- brothers and sisters of the same family can never be genuinely and effectively resolved by force, but by understanding and reconciliation.
- That Peace cannot be kept by force but can only be achieved by IV. understanding.
- That the government of Cameroon should consider the possibility of a V. mediated end to this crisis if that is the only option that is needed to end this senseless armed conflict.
- Call on the warlords both in Cameroon and in the Diaspora, and those VI. feeding fat and making money for themselves as the blood of Cameroonians keep flowing, to refrain from promoting acts of violence that dehumanize the victims.
- State emphatically that every human life is sacred and valued by God the VII. Creator for a purpose, and therefore should not be lost or taken by the whims and caprices by those who wield power, possess and command the use of arms.
- Call on all Cameroonians to be unanimous in condemning every thought, VIII. attitude, word and action that only promotes living together without ensuring that we eat together.
  - Call on all Cameroonians to cultivate the culture of love for one another, IX. forgiving one another, reconciling with one another and being one another's keeper.
  - Call on every Cameroonian to be an agent of justice and peace rather Χ. than an instrument of war and destruction.
  - Appeal to the government of Cameroon to grant a general amnesty to all XI. those arrested and imprisoned with respect to the Anglophone crisis.
- Declare that we are apolitical, but should not be considered inactive and XII. passive in playing our roles as Religious Leaders in national issues that affect the lives of Cameroonians.
- Declare our willingness and readiness as Religious Leaders of Cameroon XIII. to use our various institutions and means to objectively, faithfully, fearfully and lovingly assist, if not play a front role to bring about a just and peaceful end to the armed conflict ravaging Anglophone Cameroon and other major national crises.
- And call on every God-fearing Cameroonian to pray without ceasing, XIV. either as individuals, groups, denominations, or nation until the Lord

hears and answers our prayers and decisively intervenes to transform our country into an oasis of justice, peace, love and progress.

The Moderator of the PCC, Rt. Rev. Fonki Samuel Forba encouraged them to uphold their integrity by refusing to compromise.
